1. Introduction

Isiqalo Primary School aligns and supports the constitutional imperatives of South Africa and the educational imperatives of the National Qualifications Framework. The School also provides opportunity for each learner to develop life skills and fostering growth of the individual and the community through the academic, extramural and other elements of the school curriculum. The notion of personal success and educational excellence refers to the potential of each child being reached academically, extramurally and spiritually. It also refers to the dedication of our educators and parents to providing educational resources and support so that our learners develop a love for learning. Learner-centred education focuses on the individual's needs and abilities, and allows diversity to be recognised within a spirit of discipline and acceptance, without compromising the integrity of Isigalo Primary School.

3. A Commitment to Excellence by upholding the Principles of the NQF
